THE MIRROR OF OUR SAVIOR

Dear Members and Friends of Our Savior,

Some of the most popular programming on TV right now are shows where people argue. Shows like *The View* have several people gathered around a table arguing different sides of an issue. Each side offers their thoughts on an important topic or feedback on a particular decision. Every channel that covers political news offers feedback on the latest events from Congress, the White House, and the fallout from the current government shutdown. Even our favorite hobbies come with plenty of debate; people have long been calling in to local sports talk radio shows to complain about their favorite teams. Former athletes are now having those arguments on TV broadcasts, offering their take on injuries, press conferences, and everything that is (and probably isn't) news. People like to argue, but shouldn't we all just get along?

As Lutherans, we know that the answer to that question is 'no.' There are some arguments that need to be held. It would have been very easy for Luther to take back what he said during the Reformation, or to just go with the flow when preaching indulgences took the place of preaching Christ. He spent close to thirty years arguing against commonly held teachings and beliefs that contradicted the Scriptures. Many church bodies still commemorate the Reformation to this day, even if they find disagreement with Luther's teaching on the Sacraments, faith, and other important doctrines. What we confess is important.

The reason I bring this up is because we are result of errors that have been embraced. You might remember the split amongst Methodist churches after their convention in 2019. Many churches had rejected their doctrinal stance on homosexuality and marriage from the Book of Discipline and refused to adhere to their convention upholding Biblical teaching. More than 6,000 churches left the United Methodist Church and founded the Global Methodist Church. Now, the Anglican Church is at the same crossroads. Sarah Mullally was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury on October 3 despite the biblical teachings against female clergy (1 Timothy 3, 1 Corinthians 14, Titus 1). Less than two weeks later, a group numbering between 50-85% of Anglicans announced they had severed ties

with the Church of England. It's another split that will affect the confession of faith around the world.

As people not directly connected to these church bodies, how should we respond? First, of course, with prayer. Pray for all those involved in such discussions, that they would be led by the Holy Spirit to seek the truth of God's Word. There's a reason that our Gospel reading for Reformation Sunday each year is from John 8: ***"If you abide in my Word, you are truly my disciples. (John 8:31b)"*** The Word of God shows us how to live as God's people and enables us to confess the faith with every generation. Second, every doctrinal schism has caused the Church to go back to the Scriptures and see *why* we confess what we believe. Get out your Bible and read those foundational texts on marriage again. Genesis 1-2, Mark 10:1-12, 1 Corinthians 7, and Ephesians 5 give us a clear picture into the blessings and designs that God has given in the lifelong union of one man and one woman. Read through your Catechism again on these topics; there are helpful questions and answers that can clarify why we take this stance. Finally, whenever we must make a defense for the faith, we keep in mind God's design for such a task: ***"in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect. (1 Peter 3:15)"*** We confess what we know to be true according to God's Word with compassion for those who disagree with us, seeking to glorify God.

Jesus prayed for his Church to be united in John 17, and that is often cited as a reason that the Church should just get along, even with those who reject the truth of Christ. Jesus also prays: ***"Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. (John 17:17)"*** There can only be unity for the Church in the Word of God. We pray that neither Lutherans nor any other Christian be led into temptation, but that God would deliver them through the truth of his Word. And we remember that, even today, *Ecclesia semper reformanda est*; the Church is always reforming. God grant that our consciences be captive to his Word alone.

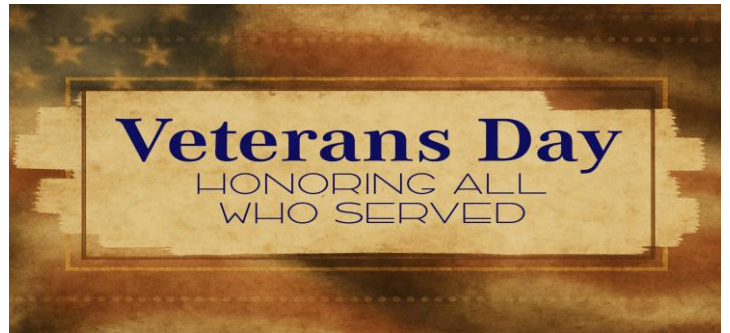

The meeting was called to order and Pastor Tessone opened with devotion and prayer.

Approval of Minutes: A motion to approve the minutes was made by Jerry Case, seconded by Melissa Matz, and the motion carried.

Pastor Tessone's Report:

Report of the Boards:

A request was approved to bring to Council a motion to approve the membership transfer of Denise Sprinkle from St. Paul's. The motion to approve the transfer was made by Joe Close on behalf of the Board of Elders, seconded by Jerry Case, and the motion carried.

There were no changes to duty services for the next month.

The Elders finalized plans for a bacon and pancake breakfast for Rally Sunday on September 7th.

Robert Schlender gave the Elders a report on their working the Lutheran booth at the State Fair.

The next Board of Elders meeting will be Monday, September 15th at 6:30pm.

Robert Schlender gave the Council a report of the Trunk-or-Treat letters sent out to each of the boards requesting them to set up booths for this event. It will be held October 24th 5-7pm in the gym. The Elders will be providing hot dogs and chips. Linda Close added that Helping Hands will be providing little bottles of water for the children. Helping Hands, the Board of Education, and Council will all have a booth.

Board of Education: Linda Close gave the report. The Sunday School plans will be in the bulletin. Cindy Titus and Shirley Camirand will be teaching the younger children (18 months to 5 years old). The parents are encouraged to stay with their child in the younger classroom or to attend the "One Room Schoolhouse."

The Youth Group lock-in went well. There were about 24 kids of varying ages in attendance. They went to the arcade and hung out at the church overnight. Youth Group will be meeting before the first Confirmation class this month at 5pm and food will be provided.

Amigos de Cristo sent a thank you note to Pastor Tessone about being included in Vacation Bible School this summer and being thankful to host VBS next summer.

St. Paul's has 79 students enrolled. They have hired a second custodian. There are eight volleyball games scheduled for the school. Teri Brines stepping down from the Foundation when her term ends. The Board of Education will see if any of the newly elected or current Board of Education members will be willing to step into that role.

The Board of Education will have a booth at the Trunk-or-Treat and will have a fishing game as well as handing out candy.

A circuit wide high school feasibility survey will be discussed at the next circuit forum.

Board of Trustees: Earl Rasa gave the report. There will be 2 members with terms ending at the end of the year.

The boiler was turned on after it was cleaned out. The issues with the elevator continue. TKL from Springfield came in to fix it, said it was fixed, but it was not working Sunday. Trustees reset the breaker, and it was working again. The Trustees will be contacting TKL to see about a refund for parts and/or service since the elevator is still not fixed. TKL charges \$562/hour for service call outs. Otis Elevator had originally said they would come look at the elevator set up but said it would probably be around \$100,000 to replace the elevator. However, when they were attempted to set up a quote appointment, they have been unresponsive.

The Trustees are planning a workday soon to paint and fix any leaks around the building.

Board of Finance: Rob Brines gave the report. The total inflow for August was \$19,072.20 with a total outflow of \$22,244.83 leaving a negative cash flow of \$3,172.63. The total inflow for Budget Year 2025 so far was \$159,967.46 with a total outflow of \$158,363.55 leaving a positive cash flow of \$1,603.91.

Rob Brines will be looking into the payments made to TKL to assist the Trustees in refund requests.

Committee Reports:

1. **Nominating Committee:** Dave Curtis advised they have some names gathered for nominations to the different boards and letters will be mailed out soon.

2. **Bylaw Committee:** Committee met two weeks ago and got about halfway through the church bylaws.

Old Business:

1. **St. Paul's Lutheran School Association Committee:** The committee is still working on the constitution and bylaws and will hopefully have financials ready for the voters' meeting in October. The next meetings scheduled are on September 17th and 29th.
