THE MIRROR OF OUR SAVIOR

December, 2025

Dear Members and Friends of Our Savior,

Every family has their Christmas traditions that are an important part of the holiday. Carols to be sung, cookies and treats to be made, those special moments that bring joy and cheer. For our family, it's regular trips through Liberty Park to look at the Christmas lights. We watch for them as we get closer to Thanksgiving, noticing where the workers are putting our favorite displays. We can see the lights from our house, and most of our trips start or end with driving through the park. Each year has added new lights and made each trip a little bit longer, but it's part of the joy we look forward to each year. December is the month with the most darkness, and the glow of the Christmas lights bring comfort and joy to many people.

Lights in the darkness are a valuable part of our Christmas celebrations. Throughout the life of the Church, God's people have looked for light in the darkness. And that's why, in our Wednesday services throughout the season of Advent, we use the service of Evening Prayer. Evening Prayer is based off the ancient service of Vespers, which would be sung as darkness descended on the monastery. It's much easier for us to find a light in the darkness; just flip the light switch and the whole room lights up. Electricity is a modern innovation, though. As the service of Vespers began, lamps were lit with thanksgiving for light. Evening Prayer begins with a thanksgiving for light, and a light far greater than the blinking lights in Liberty Park. ***“Jesus Christ is the Light of the world. (John 8:12)”*** As we gather for worship on Wednesday evenings, there is darkness all around us. The sun has gone down, the darkness of sin hangs over the creation, and who knows what evils take place under the cover of darkness? And yet, Jesus Christ continues to be the world's light; ***“the light no darkness can overcome. (John 1:5)”*** Even as evil and suffering continue in a broken world, the forgiveness of sins and Christ's victory over sin and death continue to bring light to the world. We pray for that victory to come to us even now: ***“Let your light scatter the darkness (1 Corinthians 4:5)”*** ***And illumine Your Church (2 Corinthians 4:6)”*** The light scatters the darkness through the preaching and teaching of Christ, for which we gather. In the growing darkness of the

season and the darkness of a sinful world, the light of God's Word shines on us.

Following the opening verses, we sing a hymn that can be traced back to the days of Basil the Great, who served as Bishop in Caesarea and died in 379. It's faith worship of God connected to Christians of the past 1700 years! The *Phos Hilaron*, or *Gladsome Light*, is a hymn addressed to Christ. In ancient days, it was during the *Phos Hilaron* that the candles in the chancel were lit. It's a beautiful imagery for the candles to flicker into light as the Church sings ***“Joyous light of glory of the Immortal Father.”*** Jesus dwells with his people in their prayers; ***“the people walking in darkness have seen a great light (Isaiah 9:2)”***

The Service of Light concludes with a prayer of thanksgiving. We have looked to the Light of the world to give us light, and the Church gives honor and glory to God for the light he has given to us and to all his people. The prayer of thanksgiving builds on the light of God's guidance given to all generations, blessing God for his continual care to generation after generation. ***“Blessed are You, O Lord our God, king of the universe.”*** The Lord rules over the universe, who heard his words on day one of his creation: ***“Let there be light, and there was light. (Genesis 1:3)”*** God continued to show his mercy to the Israelites as they wandered in the wilderness: ***“...who led Your people Israel by a pillar of cloud by name and a pillar of fire by night.”*** The people were led to the Promised Land thanks to God's continual light and guidance. Is God going to change how he cares for his creation now? Certainly not. ***“Enlighten our darkness by the light of Your Christ; may His Word be a lamp to our feet and a light to our path.”*** God continues to guide us just as he has the people of the past.

Lights twinkling in the darkness are a beloved part of the Christmas season. As we prepare for our Savior's birth and his glorious appearing to make all things new, those lights remind us of Jesus Christ, the Light of the World. We wait for that day with hope: ***“Arise, shine, for our light has come! (Isaiah 60:1)”***

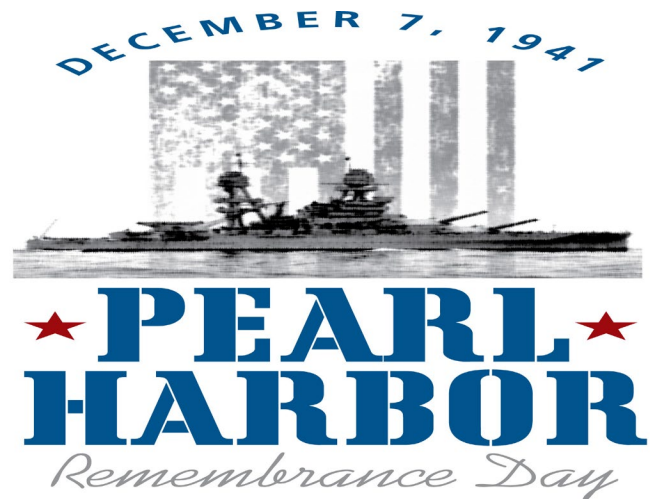

Council Minutes October 1, 2025

Attendance: Pastor Tessone, Linda Close, Joe Close, Melissa Matz, Lloyd Heisterberg, Robert Brines, Earl Rasa, Jerry Case, Dave Curtis, Heather Hawkins-Hoehne

The meeting was called to order and Pastor Tessone opened with devotion and prayer.

Approval of Minutes: A motion to approve the minutes was made by Jerry Case, seconded by Joe Close, and the motion carried.

Pastor Tessone's Report:

Pastor Tessone has been working his way through his shut-in visits for the month of October.

Confirmation has resumed, with classes from 6pm to 7:15pm on Sunday nights.

The Youth Group is planning to meet before Confirmation classes on Sunday evenings.

Pastor Tessone has arranged and prepared all the Sunday Services through October 5th. He served the people of Amigos de Cristo on September 21st.

Sunday morning Bible class has begun going through the books of the Bible. We are going through Genesis and looked at the Biblical account of the flood this past Sunday. Men's Bible study continues their study on Islam. Women's Bible study continues their book on following Jesus in an age of confusion, and the morning Bible study has been looking at the readings for the coming Sunday each week.

Chapel at St. Paul's continues each Wednesday at 8:15am, and all are welcome for chapel.

Pastor Tessone attended the pastor's conference September 9th at Faith, Warsaw, the installation of Rev. Keven Koester at Stover September 7th, the Marriage and Family Conference meeting September 18th. He also attended the Association meetings on September 17th and September 29th, and our bylaws committee had two meetings on September 16th and 30th.

Report of the Boards:

Board of Elders: Joe Close gave the report. The membership report for September was 372 Baptized and 273 Communicants. The average September 2025 attendance was 105.

The Board of Elders held their regular meeting on September 15th. Pastor Tessone opened the meeting with a devotion and his report that included his home visits with shut-ins, which was greatly appreciated.

There were no changes to duty services for the next month.

There were no transfers in or out.

The Rally Day breakfast was discussed, and it was reported that it had donations totaling \$162.25 and was well received.

The Elders finalized plans for the Trunk-or-Treat event scheduled for Friday, October 24th. They will be providing hot dogs.

The Elders had a report on more of the Telecare Committee's calls. The program is working well and the Elders appreciate the information that they receive and feel it is a valuable outreach to members that are attending church and those that are not.

The Elders completed their part of the 2026 budget. They discussed the viability of some of the line items and with Pastor's suggestions made appropriate changes to the numbers. Changes were made when it came to Altar Guild, supplies, bulletins, and special

worship supplies. The Elders are ready to submit that information as part of the budget process.

Board of Education: Linda Close gave the report. The Board of Education has been working on their portion of the proposed 2026 budget and have reduced it to a proposed \$10,000 for the year.

Sunday School continues with Genesis in the "One Room Schoolhouse."

St. Paul's Lutheran School currently has 79 students enrolled. There are four teachers attending the LEA Convocation. The St. Paul's students will be singing at Our Savior Lutheran Church in February. The children finished their mum sales.

A Higher Things retreat will be November 7th-8th at St. Matthew in Lee's Summit. It is \$45 for each middle school through high school students for the overnight stay.

Youth Group will be the 4th Sunday of each month at 4:30p.m. and will include food and activities.

For the Trunk-or-Treat on October 24th the Board of Education has planned a game and will have Goldfish Crackers for treats. Jill Robinson has plans for a Dungeons and Dragons themed table and game.

Board of Trustees: Earl Rasa gave the report. A workday is scheduled for October 13th to include painting, sealing, etc.

The Trustees are currently looking into snow removal bids. S&T provided services last year and Beverly Dillon's grandson had helped as well.

Masters Elevator came by and gave an estimate of \$80,800 to replace the elevator. TKL quoted close to \$170,000. As of right now, the elevator does not work most of the time, and they are not contacting TKL because they are not fixing it when they are called out. Hopefully, the Trustees will have more estimates before October's voters' meeting and will be looking into fundraising to assist with the replacement costs.

Board of Finance: Rob Brines gave the report. The total inflow for September was \$20,609.23 with a total outflow of \$24,299.17 leaving a negative cash flow of \$3,689.94. The total inflow for Budget Year 2025 so far was \$180,576.69 with a total outflow of \$182,662.72 leaving a negative cash flow of \$2,086.03.

The uncoded offerings did not show up in the report in 10 instances that will have to be manually corrected, hence the negative cash flows.

Committee Reports:

1. **Nominating Committee:** Dave Curtis advised the letters have gone out, and some have agreed to be nominated while others have not. Hopefully, he will have more names by Saturday.

2. **Bylaw Committee:** Committee has finished the constitution and bylaws and will go over it one more time at their next meeting before presenting it to the voters.

3. **Association Committee:** The Committee met on Monday and went over a final review, and the plan is to have a copy for the voters' meeting in October and vote on it at the January voters' meeting prior to sending it to the District for approval.

Old Business:

1. **Budget:** The Council wrote out the proposed budget for 2026 to present at the voters' meeting. Jerry Case made a motion to approve the budget for presentation; it was seconded by Joe Close and the motion carried.

New Business:

1. **Ellis/Virginia Moore Estate:** Terry Gertz brought in a check for \$2600 for the Virginia Moore account.
