THE MIRROR OF OUR SAVIOR

March, 2026

Dear Members and Friends of Our Savior,

The Roman empire stretched over parts of three continents, even though it only lasted for about 400 years. The empire helped shape Western civilization and our understanding of architecture, law, government, and language. One of the things that helped the empire flourish was a universal language. Latin was the dominant language, and it influenced a translation of the Bible into Latin, called the Vulgate, towards the end of the Roman Empire's dominance. As a result of their expanding empire, a new phrase was coined that continues to be used to this day. In order to humble generals and leaders who had overwhelmed their lands, slaves would whisper "*memento mori*." It translates to "Remember that you must die." Over time, *memento mori* artwork became popular. Paintings and sculptures would highlight the theme of death with skulls, clocks, hourglasses, and extinguished candles to serve as a reminder that every life will some day end.

We began Lent with that same reminder: "***for you are dust, and to dust you shall return. (Genesis 3:19b)***" Ash Wednesday gives us the reminder to humble ourselves before the hand of Almighty God, who has created us. Sin's curse dwells in each and every one of us, and we do not know how long we are given to live on the earth. The generations of saints before us encourage us to remember the fact that we will die. The only Psalm attributed to Moses reminds us, "***You return man to dust and say, 'Return, O children of man.' (Psalm 90:3)***" The prophet Isaiah prepares the Israelites for earthly exile by reminding them of earthly death: "***The grass withers, the flower fades when the breath of the LORD blows on it; surely the people are grass. (Isaiah 40:7)***" The early Church held that reminder in the midst of the Roman empire. They readily acknowledged "*memento mori*," we must all die. God himself speaks for the benefit of his earthly servants in Revelation 14: "***Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on.' 'Blessed indeed,' says the Spirit, 'that they may rest from their labors, for their deeds follow them! (Revelation 14:13)***" Death is at work in a fallen world, and it is something we cannot and should not forget.

Here's the question you're probably thinking: why? Why on earth would I want to spend my life remembering that I'm going to die? Wouldn't it be better to think about, well, literally anything else? Our culture certainly acts that way, avoiding death at all costs. Gone are the days of families caring for the body of a deceased loved one, we no longer have to dig the grave and put up a grave marker. We pay someone else to do all of that work and do everything possible to pretend that the life of a loved one has not ended. Our culture is terrified of death, so why remember it? The remembrance of death was not a reason for fear, but focus. When you recognize that you are going to die one day, it keeps your focus on living each day like it matters. Andy Dufresne says as much in *The Shawshank Redemption*: "Get busy living, or get busy dying." Roman emperor Marcus Aurelius said, "You could leave life right now. Let that determine what you do and say and think." Remembering your death every day reminds you of the value that has been placed on your life. It helps you appreciate each day, avoiding laziness and wasting time.

As Christians, we have more reason than the average person to remember our death. Martin Luther encouraged people to wake up each morning and make the sign of the cross in remembrance of their baptism. In baptism, you died and were raised with Christ. Death no longer has dominion over you. So, as you remember that you must die, you also remember that you must be raised according to the promise that God has made. And finally, since you will die, that's all the more reason to apply what you have to the wisdom of God's Word. "***You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself. (Luke 10:27)***" While you are here, *memento mori*: remember you will die. Also, *memento vivere*: remember to live, live as children of God, using the time he has given to serve. Give thanks for what you have; the forgiveness and salvation that are yours through Jesus Christ, and get busy living that eternal life!

**Council Minutes  
January 7, 2025**

**Attendance:** Pastor Tessone, Linda Close, Lloyd Heisterberg, Robert Brines, Earl Rasa, Jerry Case, Lori Hurt, Robert Schlender, Arletta Garrett, Dave Curtis, Heather Hawkins-Hoehne

The meeting was called to order and Pastor Tessone opened with devotion and prayer.

**Approval of Minutes:** A motion to approve the minutes was made by Jerry Case, seconded by Robert Schlender, and the motion carried.

**Pastor Tessone's Report:**

Pastor Tessone is working his way through shut-in visits for the month of January.

Confirmation classes continue; they studied the first portion of the Third Article of the Creed this past Sunday, and their second test will be in two weeks.

The youth group lock-in is scheduled for Friday, January 16<sup>th</sup>.

Pastor Tessone has arranged and prepared all the Sunday Services through January 11<sup>th</sup>, along with our Advent series with Pastor Freeman on our surprising Savior. He served the people of Amigos de Cristo on December 14<sup>th</sup>.

Sunday morning Bible class has begun going through the books of the Bible. They are going through Exodus and studied the crossing of the Red Sea last week. Men's Bible study continues their study on Islam. Women's Bible study will begin a new book on change January 15<sup>th</sup>, and the morning Bible study has been looking at the readings for the coming Sunday each week.

Chapel at St. Paul's continues each Wednesday.

Pastor Tessone hosted the Pastor's Conference on December 9<sup>th</sup>, attended the Marriage and Family Conference meeting December 18<sup>th</sup>, the St. Paul's Christmas program on December 18<sup>th</sup>, attended a volunteer appreciation lunch for Amigos de Cristo December 13<sup>th</sup>, and refereed basketball games at St. Paul's December 4<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>.

### **Report of the Boards:**

**Board of Elders:** Robert Schlender gave the report. The membership report for December was 369 Baptized and 270 Communicants. The average December 2025 attendance was 103.

The Elders held a pancake breakfast last Sunday in celebration of the new year. Free will donations were \$533.25 that will be forwarded to the elevator repair fund.

The Elders bring a motion to approve the transfer out of Robert and Sharee Norfleet. The motion was seconded by Lori Hurt, and the motion carried.

The Board of Elders Chairman will be elected at their next meeting.

**Board of Education:** Linda Close gave the report. Beginning in February, there will be a new Sunday School class. There will still be a class for ages 18 months to 5 years old. Michael Gertz and Laura Schuber will be working together for the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and up class.

The Board of Education discussed further outreach towards the trailer park and possibly including children in church services.

The youth group lock-in is Friday, January 16<sup>th</sup> from 7pm to 7am. They do not have to stay for the entire night but are welcome to join in the fun.

St. Paul's currently has 81 students enrolled. Miss R. started a student council. Basketball is going well. The Board of Education hosted a Christmas dinner for faculty and staff with their spouses.

The Board of Education duty assignments will be Michael Gertz as the Foundation representative, Teri Brines as the Board of Ed representative, and Linda Close will give the reports at the Council meetings.

**Board of Trustees:** Earl Rasa gave the report. Masters Elevator called to follow up on the bid. If we decide to go with them, they will need 40% down, 50% at completion, and the last 10% six months after completion to ensure all is working properly. The Board of Trustees makes a motion to accept the bid from Masters Elevator. The motion was seconded by Robert Schlender, and the motion was carried.

The furnace had gone out over the weekend. It was looked at, and it seems to have just been a blown fuse that was replaced. It is currently working well.

**Board of Finance:** Rob Brines gave the report. The total inflow for December was \$30,288.48 with a total outflow of \$21,698.03 leaving a positive cash flow of \$8,590.45. The total inflow for Budget Year 2025 so far was \$243,326.00 with a total outflow of \$272,063.73 leaving a negative cash flow of \$28,737.73.

The negative outflow for the year was the last payment to Dugan's for the flooring. The money was transferred from the Virginia Moore Trust account in 2024 and work began in 2024, so it was not reflected in the 2025 inflows.

Jerry Case is going to put a fundraising sign in the Narthex, so the congregation can see where we are with the elevator fundraising. The envelopes in the pews have helped raise month for the elevator and St. Paul's.

### **Committee Reports:**

1. **None.**

### **Old Business:**

1. **Auditing Committee:** The committee will be made up of Scott Matz, Tyler Abney, and Troy Curtis.

2. **By-laws:** The church by-laws have been updated and need to be approved to go before the voters. A motion was made by Robert Schlender to approve the changes to the by-laws and take it to the voters. The motion was seconded by Jerry Case, and the motion was carried.

3. **Helping Hands & Telecare Committee:** Helping Hands and the Telecare Committee will be giving reports on all their activities at the next voters' meeting.

### New Business:

1. **High School Genesis Project:** A survey was sent about the interest in a Lutheran High School in our area, resources available, etc. The survey will be filled out and returned.

2. **LSA Board Members:** There will be a vote (if needed) for the three board members needed to serve on the St. Paul's Lutheran School Association School Board beginning later this year. Currently, we have Linda Henderson and Mary Walters, but we still need one more.

3. **MO Scholars Explanation:** Tina Sutherland requested to give a presentation on the MO Scholars Program. The Council approved Ms. Sutherland to give her presentation after the services on February 8<sup>th</sup>.

4. **Amendment to 2026 Budget:** There is an amendment to the 2026 budget to include the \$21,000 in funds delegated to St. Paul's Lutheran School Association.
